Recipe of the Month Buckeyes

Ingredients:

1/2 pound margarine (2 sticks or 1 cup)

1 (18 ounce) jar of peanut butter 1 pound of confectioners' sugar 12 ounces of chocolate chips 3 teaspoons of vanilla small amount of paraffin

Instructions:

Cream margarine, peanut butter and vanilla. Add sugar. Make into small balls. The dough should be workable so you may need to add a little extra sugar. Dip in melted paraffin and chocolate. The dough will work better if chilled overnight. Dip with a toothpick. Makes 100 to 150 small balls.
