2025 Frank James - SkyLine **Scholarship Applications due March 7**

There's still time to apply for the Frank James – SkyLine Scholarship! In the spring of 2025, SkyLine will award a total of \$25,000 to children of SkyLine and SkyBest customers to aid with the cost of a college education. Five \$1000 scholarships, renewable up to four years, will be awarded to students who will attend a four-year college or university. Five \$500 scholarships, renewable up to two years will be awarded to students who will attend a twoyear community/technical college. The Board of Directors established the Frank James - SkyLine Scholarship in 1987. The scholarship is named in memory of Frank James, former SkyLine Board President, rural telephone advocate, longtime educator and superintendent of Ashe County Schools. Eligible applicants must be children of current, full-time residents who have a SkyLine membership or SkyBest telephone/broadband services account of at least one year; and be graduating high school seniors (including home-schooled students) in the co-op's fivecounty service area (Alleghany, Ashe, Avery, Watauga and Johnson). The scholarships will be awarded on the basis of scholastic achievement, financial need, demonstrated leadership and community involvement.

Caller ID Spoofing

Caller ID Spoofing occurs when a caller intentionally disguises their identity by altering their name and/or phone number that is displayed on your telephone. Spoofing is used most frequently for scams and conning personal information and/or money from its victims.

One tactic commonly used by scammers, called Robocallers, is neighbor spoofing. Robocallers will alter their number to appear as a local number that could be similar to your own, to increase the likelihood that you

To be eligible to apply, the student's parents must receive telephone or internet services from SkyLine or SkyBest, and the student must be a rising high school senior in the co-op's five-county service area. Other requirements include:

- submitted statement of future plans beyond high school;
- 300-word essay on a specified topic;
- 3.25 minimum grade-point-average (GPA);
- recommendation from a teacher or school official;
- involvement in school organizations;
- community volunteer activities.

Note: Children of SkyLine employees or directors are not eligible for this scholarship.

will answer the call. Unfortunately, these scam artists have the ability to frequently change the number transmitted to your caller ID to any number of their choosing at any time. Any telephone number is at risk.

To minimize your risk of falling victim to spoofing scams, pay attention to the incoming calls you accept. Do not answer any calls from unfamiliar numbers. Do not provide any information or follow any instructions if prompted by an unknown caller. SkyLine/SkyBest provides multiple features that may help reduce the threat of Robocallers connecting to your home telephone line including Anonymous Call Rejection, Selective Call Rejection and Smart Call Manager.

- 1. Create Strong Passwords. Using at least 12 characters, you should combine letters, numbers and symbols to create strong passwords. Avoid using any passwords that can be easily guessed like your birthday or your pet's name. You should also not be using the same password for all your devices.
- 2. Be Cautious When Opening Emails. Be very careful responding or clicking on any email that requires urgent action, especially when these relate to sensitive topics. Most scam emails will use scare tactics to try to compel you to give up your personal information. Be cautious of clicking on any links or attachments, and of any spelling errors in the email. If you have any doubts at all about an email being real, you should contact the company directly by phone.
- 3. Keep Your Devices Clean and Up-to-date. Make sure to keep all frequently used apps up to date. Delete apps that are no longer in use, as they can collect personal information like your location while sitting idle on your phone.
- 4. Take Charge of Your Online Presence. Be sure to monitor who has access to your information and what you decide to share.

Try not to share your login information with anyone if you can help it. Remember that it is okay to tell people what they can and cannot post of you. Zesty Lemon Cake

Ingredients:

1 package Duncan Hines Lemon Supreme cake mix

1 small package instant lemon pudding

1 cup lemon yogurt

zest of one large lemon

1/2 cup canola oil

3/4 cup orange juice

4 large eggs

Instructions:

Spray Bundt pan with Bakers Joy and set aside. Preheat oven to 350°.

In large bowl, add all ingredients and stir together. Then beat for 2 minutes on medium high speed. Pour into Bundt pan, and shake on counter to help remove air.

Bake 43-47 minutes or until cake is golden brown, and springs back when lightly pressed.

Remove pan from oven, and cool on wire rack for 20 minutes. Invert onto plate and allow to cool completely.
