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SkyLine Annual Meeting

The 67th Annual Meeting of SkyLine Membership Corporation was held on October 3, at the cooperative's Annex location just above the corporate campus on NC Highway 194 North in West Jefferson. The cooperative conducted early registration the week prior at all SkyLine Customer Centers and in the Shady Valley community. This enabled members to participate in the Annual Meeting process by registering in advance of the meeting, voting for directors and receiving materials, including the 2023 Annual Meeting Report.

The business session included reports from President R.C. Mitchell and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Kim Shepherd. Board Secretary, Jim Shepherd, announced the establishment of a quorum with 878 members registered for the meeting through early registration and inperson registration on the day of the meeting. SkyLine Attorney, Ray Parker, presided over the official business session, and the three board members were re-elected to three-year terms: Sharon Kasel of Ashe County, Bill Burleson of Avery County and Thomas Joseph McNeil of Watauga County.

This year the President's Report and Executive Report were pre-recorded and played at the meeting. President R.C. Mitchell described SkyLine as a "people-first company at its core." He explained that employees understand they are contributing to something much larger than themselves. He spoke on the pride SkyLine employees have in helping connect our rural areas to the rest of the world through broadband service.

"Our genuine desire to equip local residents with the same technology advancements of urban areas truly starts from within and has done so for 72 years - and running," Mitchell addressed.

He referenced SkyLine Membership Corporation's 2023 Annual Meeting Report titled, "It Starts From Within." Mr. Mitchell explained that the work, progress and expansions completed daily at SkyLine would be impossible if it were not for the passion of helping others that employees at SkyLine possess. He described the importance of each unique role.

"Our growth and expansion would be impossible without the teamwork of our amazing staff. We are grateful to have people who care, and we hope it pleases you, our members, to know we deliver on our commitment to bring the highest quality of service to every door."

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HR Manager, Angie Miller, delivered the invocation at the 2023 Annual

2022 Capital Credits Allocated

Capital credits are one of the many benefits of being served by a telephone cooperative. SkyLine Membership Corporation has allocated the net margins from 2022 to the capital credit accounts of its members.

Capital credits for cooperative members result from a surplus of funds remaining from doing business. If the revenues paid into the cooperative during the financial year exceed the expenses, the remainder is known as the "margin." The margin is then allocated to SkyLine's member-owners. Allocations are based on end user revenue including members' recurring monthly charges such as local services, as well as monthly long-distance charges.

The 2022 margin represented approximately 31 percent of SkyLine's total revenues, and this percentage has been assigned to members' capital credit accounts. Members' individual allocations are based on their share of the margin, and are determined by their usage of SkyLine's services and network.

The 2022 allocated capital credits will be retired to members at a future date, as approved by SkyLine's Board of Directors. In the meantime, members' unretired capital credits are used by the co-op to maintain a solid

financial base, to build equity and to provide quality, affordable service. Individual notices are not mailed to members; however, if you have questions about your capital credit account, please call your local SkyLine Customer Service Center at 1-800-759-2226.

Mitchell also mentioned the co-op's early retirement of capital credits to members ages 75 and older, which was first made available in 2021 and is a one-time option to receive current capital credits refunded at net present value. "The financial stability of your co-operative allowed the Board to authorize \$2.2 million in capital credit and estate refunds."

CEO Kim Shepherd reflected on two words that SkyLine embodies, "broadband" and "community." Shepherd discussed the enormous presence broadband has in our daily lives, even when we do not realize it.

"We are experts in our industry and we know how to run and operate a broadband company. We may make a mistake or two along the way as we are all human. But, when we do, we won't stop until it is corrected and any impacts properly addressed and I promise you that we learn from the experience."

She addressed SkyLine's excellent Net Promoter score (NPS) of 93 to emphasize that SkyLine does 'broadband' well.

Her second word was, "community." She discussed the many ways SkyLine gives back to those in its service area. From giving back to local food pantries to sponsoring local events to providing thousands of dollars in scholarships yearly, SkyLine cares about the community. Furthermore, Shepherd discussed ways individual employees give back to their communities in their spare time.

"Many coach youth sports teams, numerous folks serve on volunteer fire departments, and a significant number of employees serve their local church in some way. And it isn't uncommon to see one of our outside employees helping remove a tree from a road or helping someone change a flat tire," she explained.

Shepherd encouraged members to look at the financials in this year's Annual Meeting Report. The cooperative's consolidated operating income for 2022 was right at \$13.5 million and our investment in total plant has increased to over \$340 million. Shepherd assured members that the solid financial position of the company will provide more opportunities for growth and expansions into unserved and underserved areas, bringing access to those in desperate need of broadband connectivity.

The business session featured a video presentation that recognized eight area high school graduates who received local scholarships through SkyLine. The 2023 recipients are: McKenzie Hudson and Nicholas Rea of Alleghany County; Britny Contador and Austin Hart of Ashe County; Bray Guest of Avery County; Benjamin Parker of Watauga County; Kyla Tolliver and Kayla Sluder of Johnson County.

SkyLine announced five \$100 cash prizes and the grand prize: a Samsung 4K Ultra High-Definition LED TV and a Samsung Bluetooth Sound Bar System. The \$100 cash prize winners were Christian Grayson Lucas, Lena Roland, Michael and Suzanne Averill, Mary Evans and Billy Ray Miller. Rick Turnmire won the grand prize.
